Proposed Revisions to Title 5, California Code of Regulations Relating to Burden-Free Access to Instructional Materials (First Reading)

ADDING NEW SECTION 54221 TO SUBCHAPTER 4 OF CHAPTER 5 OF DIVISION 6 OF TITLE 5 OF THE CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS.

§ 54221. Burden-Free Access to Instructional Materials.

(a) Governing boards shall adopt policies that ensure student access to textbooks and supplemental materials that are needed on the first day of class. Practices that enable first day access to zero-cost resources include, but are not limited to, the following:

(1) adapting or adopting open educational resources for some or all textbook and ancillary material, when the option is available; and

(2) copying initial textbook chapters as permissible within copyright.

(b) Governing boards shall adopt policies that strengthen student access to other instructional materials before their required use in any course to minimize financial and administrative burdens to students.

(c) District policies shall maintain an instructor's responsibility to choose instructional materials. District policies shall also support student-centered practices that encourage the use of zero-cost instructional materials, and leverage available resources to the maximum extent feasible, including, but not limited to, the following:

(1) developing and implementing sustainable zero-textbook-cost degrees, consistent with Education Code Section 78052;

(2) adapting open educational resources to complete degrees and career technical education certificates;

(3) adopting open educational resources for courses in which OER is commonly available and prioritizing courses needed to satisfy general education requirements;

(4) establishing lending programs and maintaining college library resources to support immediate access to course materials;

(5) developing policies that enable financial aid early disbursements consistent with 34 CFR 668.164(i);

(6) encouraging and supporting students to complete their financial aid files early to receive timely disbursement; and

(7) deploying other forms of direct aid and support program resources to strengthen student financial stability.

(d) For the purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:

(1) “Instructional materials” means all of the required materials for a course including textbooks, supplemental materials and supplies. Instructional materials do not include materials used or designed primarily for administrative purposes, class management, course management or supervision.

(2) “Textbooks” means the educational resources identified in the syllabus for the course.

(3) “Supplemental materials” means additional resources that complement the textbook and enhance the learning experience. These can include a variety of materials, such as lab manuals, workbooks, homework systems, required educational software, interactive websites, journal articles, novels, and readers.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, pursuant to Chapter 2 of the California Community Colleges Board of Governors Procedures and Standing Orders, that the Board proposes to adopt the regulatory action described below after a public hearing, and consideration of all comments, objections, or recommendations received regarding the proposed regulatory action during the public comment period, which closes on October 24, 2024.

CHANGES OR MODIFICATIONS TO PROPOSED TITLE 5 AMENDMENTS

Following the public hearing and considering all timely and relevant comments received, the Board of Governors may adopt the proposed regulatory action substantially as described in this Notice or may modify the proposed regulatory action if the

modifications are sufficiently related to the original text. With the exception of technical or grammatical changes, the full text of any modified proposed regulatory action will be subject to a second 15-day notice period prior to its adoption at a subsequent Board meeting.

INFORMATIVE DIGEST

The California Community Colleges have a long-standing policy of full and open access to ensure that higher education is available and affordable for everyone. While existing infrastructure successfully delivers comparatively low tuition rates, generous tuition waivers, and some financial aid, these measures are outmatched by ever-increasing non-tuition expenses. In particular, the burden associated with accessing instructional materials required for course and program participation—textbooks, supplemental materials, and supplies—weighs heavily on students, particularly on the most marginalized, exacerbating inequity in their access to and success in higher education.

As an important strategy to advance the Board of Governors' July 2023 Resolution on Instructional Material Affordability, this regulatory action aims to prioritize the alleviation of student burdens related to acquiring required instructional materials before their required use, highlighting the importance of first day access to zero-cost resources, and institutionalizing student-centered best practices across the system. The attached Burden-Free Access to Instructional Materials draft regulation text has been updated in response to feedback provided by the Student Senate for California Community Colleges, Academic Senate for California Community Colleges, Chief Instructional Officers, Chief Student Services Officers, and the Consultation Council's comments during the May 16 and Aug. 15, 2024, meetings.
