







Essential versus Nonessential Employment⁴


Top 10 Essential Critical Infrastructure Sectors Employment 4

On April 28, 2020, the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) Program under the federal CARES Act provides assistance for unemployed or partially unemployed individuals who are not eligible for regular unemployment insurance and who are unable or unavailable to work due to COVID-19 related circumstances.
