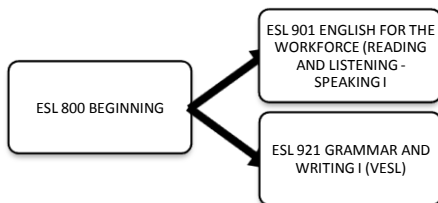

EXCITING OPPORTUNITIES FOR ESL STUDENTS!

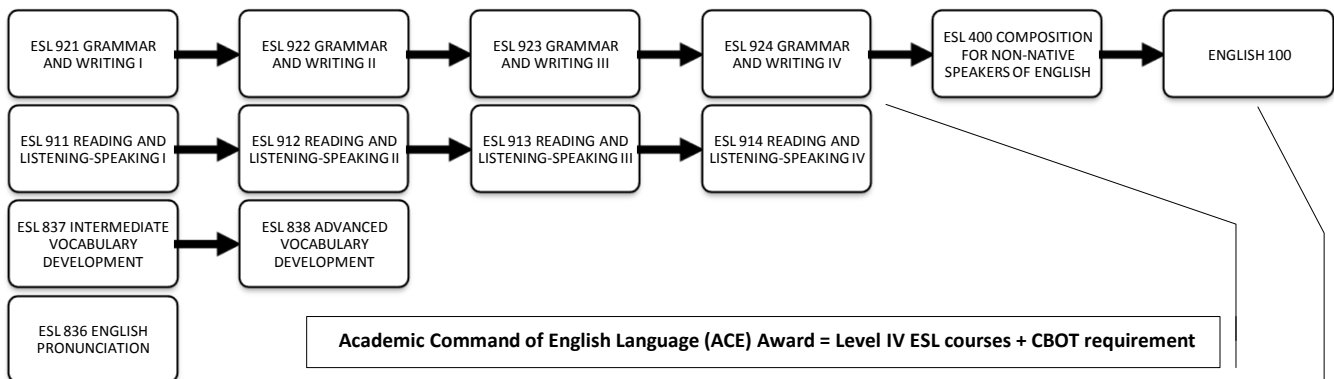
- Take Computer Business Office Technology (CBOT) courses to improve your computer skills.

OR

If by the end of Spring 2010, you have passed ESL 831 LISTENING/SPEAKING I and ESL 861 READING I, in Fall 2010, you should register for ESL 912 READING AND LISTENING-SPEAKING II

For example:

If by the end of Spring 2010, you have passed ESL 822 GRAMMAR II and ESL 841 WRITING I, in Fall 2010, you should register for ESL 923 GRAMMAR AND WRITING III.

OR

If by the end of Spring 2010, you have passed ESL 823 GRAMMAR III and ESL 843 WRITING III, in Fall 2010, you should register for ESL 924 GRAMMAR AND WRITING IV.
