# POCR (Peer Online Course Review) Capstone

Cañada College is in the process of obtaining <u>Local POCR</u> certification via POCR Capstone process. This will grant us permission to quality review (QR) our online courses and bring them to the higher quality level, while improving student accessibility and overall success. Our POCR reviewers and accessibility specialists are currently working on the second in a series of three required courses. Our goal is to certify by the end of the spring semester.

Local POCR certification will provide the green light to scale up Cañada online course review in the upcoming semesters. For that, we will require a robust team of certified POCR reviewers.
