International Student Center: We are processing applications for F-1 and Global Online Students for Fall 2021. New F-1 students coming to the USA will need to enroll in at least one class that meets on campus, so we are working with each applicant to choose at least one on-campus class. Also, we are planning our virtual achievement ceremony for international graduates, transfers and scholarship recipients which will take place via Zoom in the evening on Thursday, May 13.

Outreach Update: Working on planning PEP Events, tonight is our first PEP event! Currently also planning for Connect To College in May. Participating in Colts Con planning as well. Workshops and presentation continue at local high schools, parent meetings, local partner org meetings collaborations. Meeting with individual students/parents to help with on board process (concurrent enrollment, high school seniors and project change students).

SparkPoint Updates:

1. SparkPoint has completed two rounds of Rental Assistance. 25 students have been awarded \$1750 each = total = \$43,750
2. UWBA has just informed us that we will be launching round 3 of Rental Assistance that will fund 25 additional awards to be distributed during the 2021 calendar year.
3. The Food Grant Program is currently serving 359 Cañada students. SparkPoint is still accepting applications.
4. The Food Insecurity Basic Needs Taskforce is planning to launch a CalFresh enrollment campaign at the Community Food Markets. Individuals could receive up to \$204 / month per eligible participant.
5. The Homelessness Basic Needs Taskforce is on the verge of launching a 3-night Hotel Voucher Program for students who are housing insecure.
6. The combined Community Markets have offset our community's grocery expenditures by over \$5.2 million.

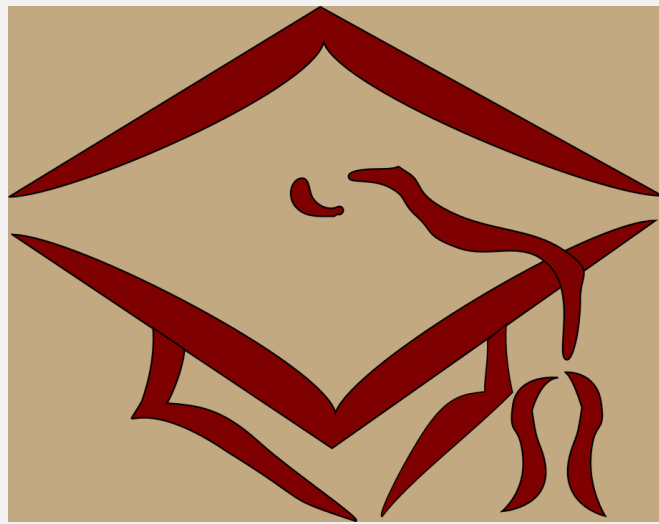

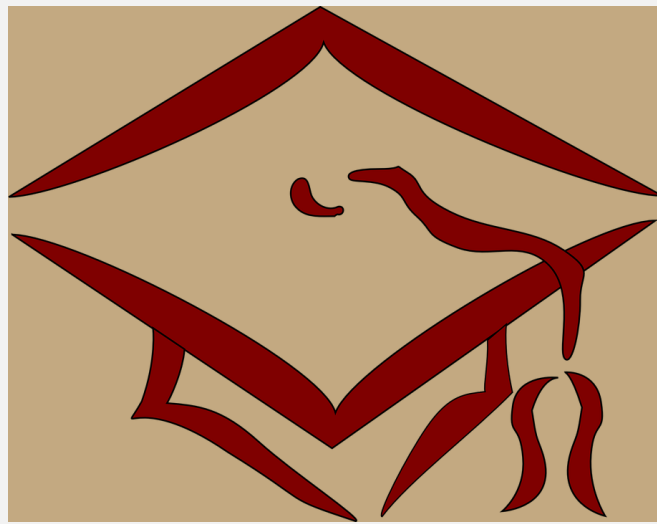
