

UC - Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)

TAG is a contract between **you** and one of the **UC campuses** listed below. A UC campus will guarantee admission to students who meet the TAG criteria and maintain the requirements.

General Information and Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a California Community College Student
- Students may file TAG application to only one UC Campus. However, they may file admission application to several UC Campuses.

The general eligibility requirements:

- Have successfully completed 30 UC transferable units including English and math requirements for general admission (see a counselor)
- Complete preparatory of courses related to your major
- Have met the TAG GPA requirement of the university of choice (varies from 2.7 to 3.4 depends on Campus and program)
- Completed 60 transferable units by the end of preceding transfer semester

To plan the required courses :

Meet with an academic counselor to discuss the course path and to develop a Student Educational Plan by:

- Identifying the Courses needed for your major
- Exploring how to apply the results of AP exams (if any)
- Exploring TAG and the requirements for campus of your choice

◆ Requires 60 Transferable units including:

- CSU GE Breadth (39-41 units) or IGETC for CSU (37 – 39 units)
- Major courses
- Elective courses (if needed)
- ◆ Must complete at least 12 units at Cañada to meet the residency requirements
- ◆ All course in major must be completed with grade of "C" or higher

- Facilitate the transfer process to a CSU campus where there is no articulation for major courses.

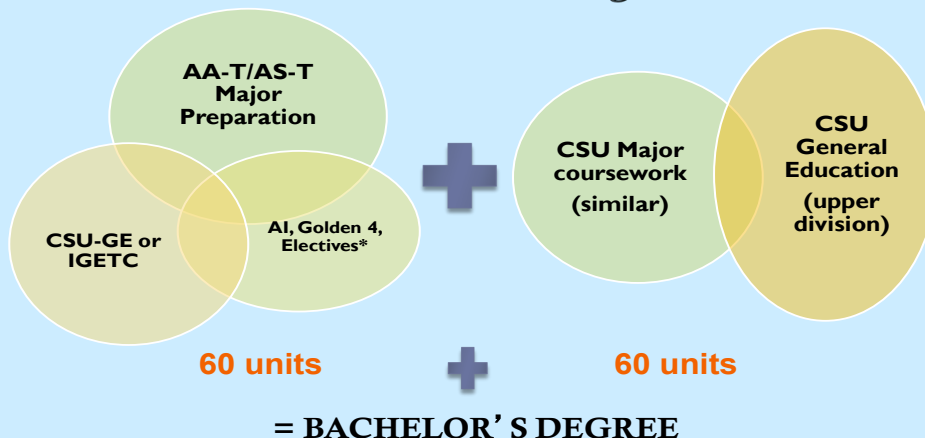
